### **African Art Printing**

KS1 have been learning about printing and exploring patterns often found in African art. We employed the very talented artist Elaine Winter to work with the children to develop their printing skills to a very high level. They were shown how to cut foam geometric shapes and use these to create a printing board. Using rollers and ink on their tiles they were able to experiment with the pattern. Ultimately the children used their print board to create a repeating pattern across calico to create a whole class African design. They look stunning.



## **Tag Rugby Competition**

Children from Year 4 and 5 very much enjoyed taking part in an Inter School Tag Rugby competition delivered by Synergy Sports. We were very proud of their effort and team work throughout the day where they finished 3rd and 4th in the competition overall.

#### **Wartime Christmas**

Y5/6 recently had a visit to Metheringham Airfield to take part in a 'Wartime Christmas' which concluded their World War Two learning. They had the experience of working alongside Aviation Heritage staff to organise rations, bake, create letters home, make homemade decorations and they took part in a dance workshop to learn a 1940s inspired routine.



Back at school, the snowmen that they made to sell at the Christmas Fair were based upon the principle of 'make do and mend' resulting in completely individual and creative products.

The children in this part of school also stayed on after school one night to do their enterprise project. Their intention was to think about how to raise finances to invest later in this year. The children decided to hold a quiz to do with parents based around their learning from this term. Biscuits were donated and they bought fruit turnovers straight from a supplier to reduce costs. When the quiz took place teams were extremely competitive, but the result was very close.



#### Congratulations to our School Council.

School Council organised a successful charity day to support the WWF. Every child in the school was able to come dressed as an animal and took part in fun animal related activities to highlight the wonderful work of the charity. The total raised for the World Wide Fund for Nature was £325.78. The School Council have also been involved in other events recently. They ran a whole school assembly about the meaning of the LEAD values and two of them, David and Hava, represented us at a cross academy event for pupils run by LEAD to enable pupils to have a voice in the future of the Multi Academy Trust.
