The pupils were honoured to be a part of this event of reflection and they were able to make purposeful links to our current topic on Bomber County.

 pupils shared poetry and sang 'The White Cliffs of Dover'. This was followed

- A group of year 5 children had the honour of taking part in the Armistice Service at RAF Waddington. They heard about the importance of remembering the sacrifices made and listened to the Military Wives Choir perform. The children gained a lot from this experience.
